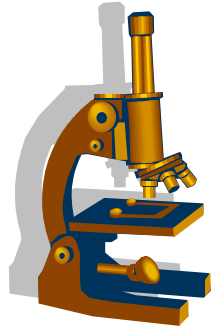

Miss Kelly's Preschool News:

The Themes for March will be:

- Solar System-Sun, Moon, Stars
- Solar System-Earth and Planets
- Weather
- Pets

We will be working on the letters S,T,U,V.

We are very excited to be starting the Solar System portion of our lessons. Math will include counting backwards and weighing and measuring. Science activities will include making craters, using a telescope and binoculars, and creating friction. We will be opening up the dramatic play area to create a space ship as well as developing our large motor skills through space walks and astronaut training.

We will also be learning about the benefits of recycling and how we can help keep the earth clean. We will be recycling a lot of the things we usually throw away so don't be surprised if your child comes home telling you to recycle!

3rd Grade News:

"Sweet" things are happening in 3rd grade. We completed our shared compare/contrast writing on Hershey's Kisses and Reese's Peanut Butter Cups. March brings reading month. Our reading and writing will focus on fables and fairy tales.

Math concepts will continue to focus on multiplication while moving into division. Please continue to practice addition, subtraction, and multiplication facts at home. Mastering these facts will allow the students to move onto harder concepts with greater ease.

Are we a state yet? Yes we are! In social studies we'll discover how Michigan's natural resources helped us grow. Gravity was the topic in science. Our little scientists will investigate sound for the science fair.

4th Grade News:

The students are involved with experimenting by using the scientific method in each science class. So far the students have been experimenting with density and with paper boat construction. Ask your child to tell you about the experiments they have done in class! Fourth graders are invited to stay after school with Mrs. Arcand on Mondays from 3:15-3:45 to have any questions answered regarding their science fair projects. Parents are welcome to join us at this time also. Remember that the annual science fair will be held on March 22nd from 3:30 to 5:00. Projects are to be completed at home by the students with some guidance from parents. Young scientists should be using the packet that was given to them as a guide while doing their science fair projects at home.

In math the 4th graders have been working hard to master fractions! This has been difficult, but they are doing great!

Government has been the main focus in social studies. Ask your child to tell you what they have learned about our government, why we have rules and laws, and taxes!

Research, research, and more research!!! That's what the 4th graders have been doing to write their big research reports this month.

5th Grade News:

The fabulous fifth grade has been full of fun and learning and there's more to come! The scientists just got down and dirty by dissecting a pig's heart. Thank you to all of the parents that were able to assist us during this wonderful learning opportunity. We will finish up the circulatory system and then move on to the excretory and nervous system; thus completing our unit on the human body. Please make sure your child is working on their science fair projects as the fair is quickly approaching. Remember - for those that would like extra help, Science Fair Mondays are happening after school from 3:30 - 4:00 in both of the 5th grade rooms.

In social studies, our young colonists will be diving deep into what life was like for those who first started our nation. As mathematicians, we'll finish up the unit on measurement, area and volume and will then move on to exploring geometry. Get ready for protractors!

During National Reading Month (March) we will be reading fantasy novels and the students will continue to work in their literature circles. The books we'll be reading are: The Indian in the Cupboard, Tuck Everlasting and Bridge To Terabithia - each are a fantastic read and display the elements of a fantasy. Literature circles are designed to be independently run by the students, with teacher direction, of course, but give the students ownership over their reading while building leadership and team-building skills. Mrs. Burr- English:

This month in English will prove to be an exciting month for the high school students! 7th grade has finished their mystery novel and the study of the components a mystery novel contains. Now, they will use their knowledge to write their very own mystery stories! 8th grade has just completed their study of historical fiction, and they will now be working with expository text to research and write a persuasive essay. 9th grade is continuing their study of *To Kill a Mockingbird* and trying to answer the philosophical questions about why we stereotype others in our society. The freshman class will also take the Explore test this month to help them prepare for the PLAN test next year and the ACT test they will take as 11th graders. The 10th grade has finished *Of Mice and Men*, and we have had some deep discussions about the existence of symbiosis in human relationships. We will now investigate another symbiotic relationship in the story *Tuesdays with Morrie*. The 10th grade will also take the PLAN test, a pre-ACT test that will help them prepare for the ACT next year. The 11th grade is getting ready to begin a unit on making effective decisions. We will evaluate the decisions characters make in literature (namely *Hamlet*) to

understand how we can make effective decisions in real life. This could not come a better time since they are now preparing to take the ACT test this month. And last but not least, the senior class will continue to investigate the quality of leadership. We will be moving forward and evaluating the leadership decisions of characters in novels such as *The Grapes of Wrath* and *The Great Gatsby*. In addition to all these activities, March is National Reading Month, and we are devoting a great amount of time to festivities that will enhance our reading experience. So, everyone have a great month and remember to read!

Ms. Tabone- Math:

Pi Day is quickly approaching! All of the students are currently working on projects for Pi Day. They are researching the history of the number along with learning practical uses for Pi. The official holiday is March 14 but we will be celebrating it in school the following day, Monday, March 15. Along with the projects, the 8th graders are learning about exponents on a higher level now. They are multiplying, dividing, and using them in algebraic expressions, with various bases, and so on. The 9th graders are delving into quadratic equations and their graphs. They are learning how changing a small part of an equation has a drastic result on the representation of that equation on the coordinate plane. Geometry students in the 10th grade are studying reflections, rotations, dilations, and all things that change the way they see shapes. They are learning the math behind moving objects. Our Algebra II students in the 11th grade are preparing for the MME in the second week of March. They have been doing small review problems periodically and are currently studying Pascal's Triangle. In Probability and Statistics the seniors are wrapping up their unit on calculating differences between two sample tests and determining the likelihood of events happening.

Mr. Sagan- Social Studies:

In the seventh grade we began our unit on Asia and will explore the history and geographic features of those countries. The 8th graders are learning about the Industrial Revolution, the Progressive Era, and Reform in the United States. In the 9th grade

American History course we are learning about suffragists and prohibition by creating posters, slogans, and drawings for a hallway bulletin board. Our 10th grade civics class is studying the role of local government and how it collects revenue and makes the lives of ordinary people better. We have also been debating such issues as increased security in schools and animal rights. The 11th graders are learning about the history and cultures of the Muslim world. The 12th grade students are researching the turmoil in the Balkans and writing a newspaper article on those issues. We will be working on a project on one country located in Europe by creating a three dimensional model that will highlight the major geographical features of that country.

Mr. Gabridge – Fine Arts:

Elementary students will be working on projects involving pattern, repetition and texture and how those elements can be used to change the look of their artwork.

High school students in Film Making will be wrapping up their animated movie while Drawing and Painting begins working on their playing card self portrait. In honor of reading month students in Basic Design have paired up with third graders in Mrs. Cmarik's class to create an illustrated children's book which they will share with the class when they are finished.

Ms. Kaufman- Computer Class:

Kindergarten: Students will be learning where the letters are on the keyboard. The students will focus on 2-hand typing and will learn how to handle a CD-ROM (using Type to Learn Jr.).

1st Grade: The students will continue working on their ABC books in Kidpix. The students will use a variety of tools in the program to do this. They will learn how to save a document. We will also work on how to use the Internet to find information on different topics.

2nd Grade: The students will discuss and research what technology is and where they use it at home and at school. The students will work with clipart and how to resize objects. They will also work on formatting in Microsoft Word with font and alignment.

3rd Grade: The students will begin their Michigan ABC PowerPoint. The students will take things and places that they have learned about Michigan in social studies and create an ABC slideshow. They will focus on the basic functions in the PowerPoint program.

4th Grade: The students will take the information about their government technology and create a detailed PowerPoint about it. They will focus on retrieving images from the Internet of the technology for their slideshow and animations for each slide.

5th Grade: Students will work on Internet safety information. We will do research, watch a video, and discuss several different concepts for Internet safety.

6th Grade: The students will continue working on their newsletter in Publisher. They are researching and reporting on new technologies from the medical, sports, entertainment, space, education, military, and environment fields.

7th Grade: Students will create a spreadsheet in Excel where they will plan a party and create formulas to calculate totals and lists of information. They will research on the Internet to find appropriate data for this project. The students will also create an email account and practice attaching a variety of documents to it.

8th Grade: Students will work on formulas in Excel and applying them to real life situations. The students will create a monthly budget and see if they have enough money for it and where they would have to cut corners on their spending. The students will create an email account to send attachments for finished assignments.

Mr. Jagelewski-Physical Education:

Thank you to everyone who helped participate in Jump Rope and Hoops for Heart this year. The money is due by March 5th, 2010. We have jumped off to a good start with the Jump Rope and Hoops for Heart. We are close to \$700 between five

different students. A special thanks goes out to Breanna Long who raised \$125 and Willow Hollingsworth who raised \$410. Thank you very much for the other participants so far.

Students in Kindergarten through Second have just finished up Jump Rope for Heart. They will start hula hooping and continuing working on their motor skills.

Students in third through sixth just finished up Jump Rope for Heart. They will start broom ball and floor hockey.

Students in seventh and eighth will work on cardiovascular endurance. They will also continue with the nutrition health program. The 8th graders will start their substance abuse unit.

9th grade health will be going over nutrition, learning about how fast food affects your body, and watching Super Size Me.

The Team Sports class will start playing European Hand ball.

Community Health students have been trying to get the school to have a go green label, which means our school is helping the environment. One of their major projects is to raise \$35 to adopt an ocelot.

We will fund raise by having students sit out at lunch and collect change. Once we have collected the funds, they will have a photo of the animal in the hallway, so everyone will see what it looks like.

Grades Three and Four will continue working with our first wind instrument, the recorder. We now feel comfortable enough with the B-A-G notes that we will begin to expand our repertoire

The Middle School Concert Band will be busy preparing the remainder of our MSBOA Festival Music, and also the music for our Spring Performance.

The High School Choir will continue working on basic music theory and sight singing fundamentals. Also, we will begin working on two and three part acappella

Mrs. Goldyn- Foreign Language:

The 3rd grade is learning about places in the community in Spanish. 4th graders finished their *Mi Monstruo* books. They will be doing a thematic unit on *Huevos Verdes con Jamón*. In this unit they will be learning about prepositions, weather and food. I will also be holding a sewing class for 4th graders who are interested, starting March 3rd in the high school Spanish room. It runs from 3:20 to 4:00 on Wednesdays. There will be four sessions. Sign up sheets are in the elementary and high school offices. The 5th grade is going to be reading *Si Llevas un Ratón a la Escuela*. In this thematic

unit students will be learning about school and subjects in Spanish. The 6th graders have almost finished *Dolores Fernández Huerta*, a labor lobbyist and will be working on *¿Qué quieres hacer?* They will be learning about sports, weather and hobbies. The 7th and 8th graders will be finishing stories of *El Pelo de Pepe* and moving into *El Hipo de la Llama* unit. They are learning about the past tenses. In the high school, Spanish I is finishing *La Tienda de Ropa* and will start *El Boleto de la Lotería*. They are going to be learning about direct object pronouns. They will begin reading *Pobre Ana* this month. Spanish II have started *El Restaurante Elegante* unit. They are almost finished with *Realidades* Capítulos 4. We will be starting our second novel *Casi Se Muere*. French I is nearly done with the stories *Le Magasin de Vêtements* and will be jumping into *Le Billet de Loterie*. They are starting their novel *Pauvre Anne* as well. French II will be working on *Quelle Coïncidence!* stories. They are working out of the French Discovering Text Unité 1 et 2. French II will also start reading their first novel by the end of this month *Fama Va en Californie*. All high school French and Spanish classes have finished their Culture Project and will present them to their classmates at the beginning of this month.

Mrs. Grabinski Resource Room:

In our classroom we will be continuing to focus on reading using the FAST program. We're working on increasing our reading fluency by reading in phrases. We are also helping our reading comprehension by asking who, what, when, where, and why questions, before, during, and after we read. Most recently we've been introduced to the different ways to spell words with the long e vowel sound. In writing we'll continue focusing on proper sentence structure as well as overall organization, including proper paragraph form. We will be reviewing different strategies to solve open ended math problems in mathematics, and upper elementary students will be working with fractions as well.

Mrs. Rodriguez Resource Room News:

Students have been learning to read and spell words with vowel variations, which is one of the toughest

concepts in the F.A.S.T. program. Then, in the area of mathematics, they have been studying customary length and capacity. Beyond that, students have been striving to improve their writing skills by working on sentence fluency. They have also been using the COPS (capitals, organization, punctuation, and spelling) method to self-check all of their writing. Keep up the good work!
